The Lake Hopatcong Foundation purchased the Lake Hopatcong Train Station in November 2014. The building, which is now listed on the National and New Jersey Registers of Historic Places, is undergoing a rehabilitation for future use as the Lake Hopatcong Cultural and Environmental Center and future LHF office. One of the Lake Hopatcong Station’s most distinct features was its green Spanish tile roof. Although these roofs are designed to last 100 years, the original tiles were removed and replaced with shingles during the 1950s or ‘60s. As part of the restoration of the station, this December we plan to reinstall an authentic tile roof. Ludowici Brookville Green glazed tiles can still be ordered from the original manufacturer in New Lexington, Ohio.
